## **Homeowner/Renter Palm Trees on the Swale**

As new homeowners and renters become a member of the Monaco Estates community, they might not realize that they are responsible for the care of the palm trees at curbside. These street palms must be kept trimmed as fronds die out during natural growth.

However, if one of your palms becomes diseased by rot, wilt, fungus, blight, or phytoplasma disease you have to cut it down. If you suspect a potentially infected tree, you should dispose of it immediately to stop the spread to healthy palms nearby. If you have to remove both of your curbside palms, then you must replant the area with at least one new palm.

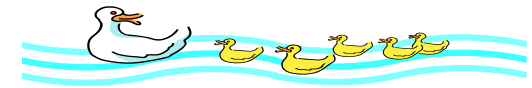
